Thurbon Road	Archie Clarence Thurbon (1893-1966)	Early Canberra resident and sportsman Moved to Canberra in 1912; attended the ceremony to name the nation's capital in 1913. Worked at Royal Military College, Duntroon, 1912-16. Plan printer at Acton Offices, 1916-58; served as an official weather recorder for a number of years. Caretaker, Acton Hall and of the first government tourist camp on Molonglo River. Played soccer with Duntroon, 1913 and Canberra, 1914; early member of the Canberra Rifle Club and an A-grade cricketer for many years. Member, Canberra Highland Society & Burns Club, 1925; foundation member and president, Acton Park Tennis Club, 1927; Life member, ACT Horticultural Society and caretaker, Canberra Masonic Temple, 1929-58.
