

Beanland Street	Linda Eileen Beanland	Queensland public service
	(1913-2004)	Awarded the Imperial Service Medal in 1979 for service as Manageress, Queensland Railways.
Cartledge Street	Jack Pickering Cartledge CMG (1900-1966)	South Australian public service Chairman of the SA Housing Trust 1945-65; Draftsman in charge of Consolidation of Statutes SA 1959-65; Assistant Parliamentary Draftsman 1926-59. Guided the construction and development of the satellite town of Elizabeth.
Grosvenor Street	Marjory Millicent Halligan (nee Grosvenor) MBE (1900-1995)	Commonwealth public service Confidential stenographer and typist to three Australian prime ministers. One of the first public servants to be transferred to Canberra, initially serving Prime Minister Stanley Bruce for two years and then Prime Minister James Scullin. Personal secretary to Prime Minister Joseph Lyons from 1932 until her marriage in 1936 to Mr Reginald Halligan who was appointed Acting Administrator of Norfolk Island.
Mick Shann Terrace	Sir Keith Charles Owen (known as Mick) Shann CBE (1917-1988)	Chairman of the Public Service Board 1977-78. Deputy Secretary, Department of Foreign Affairs 1970-73; Ambassador to Japan 1974-77; Ambassador to Indonesia 1962-66; Ambassador to the Philippines 1957-59. Senior External Affairs Representative, London 1959-62; Minister, Manila 1955-56; First Secretary, later Counsellor and Acting Minister, United Nations New York 1949-52. Joined the Department of External Affairs in 1946 and retired in 1978.

Timbs Street Maurice Carmel Timbs AO Commonwealth public service, administrator

Secretary, Department of Administrative Services 1975-76; Secretary, Department of Services and Property 1973-75. Executive Commissioner, Australian Atomic Energy Commission 1960-73; First Assistant Secretary, Prime Minister's Department 1951-60; Department of Treasury 1948-50; Department of Taxation 1946-48; war service with AIF Artillery 1940-45; Department of Trade and Customs 1936-40. Also served as Commissioner for Australian British Phosphate Commissioners 1976-87 and trustee/director of public companies and charitable institutions.
