DETERMINATION OF FEES

DETERMINATION NO. 103 OF 1991

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Liquor Act 1975 (the Act) was amended from 19 December 1990 to introduce a new licence category - a Special licence, which is to cater for liquor operations that do not conform to the requirements of a mainstream licence, that is, General licence, Club licence, On licence, Off licence. A consequence is that fees for renewing, surrendering and terminating a Special licence need to be determined on each occasion a Special licence is issued. In some instances the fees may be the same as that of a mainstream licence or may be tailored to a particular licensee's operation.

The licensee of The Australian Pizza Kitchen has been issued a Special liquor licence permitting the sale of liquor including beer brewed on the premises at Bailey's Corner, London Circuit. No other category of licence provides for a brewery operation and the sale of its products on the same premises.

The Determination provides for the liquor licence renewal, surrender and termination fees payable under sections 40(1), 40A(1), 42B(2)(c) and 42D of the Act by the licensee of The Australian Pizza Kitchen.
