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Explanatory Memorandum

This explanatory note relates to the amendments to be introduced into the Assembly by Brendan Michael Smyth MLA, Minister for Urban Services.

Overview of the amendments

The purpose of the amendments is:

- a) To amend the commencement date of the *Road Transport Legislation Amendment Act 1999* to align with the commencement of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999*.
- b) To make consequential amendments to other Acts due to the Road Transport Legislation.

Outline of Amendments

- The amendment has been made to revise the commencement date of the *Road* Transport Legislation Amendment Act 1999 from 1 December 1999 to the date when the Road Transport (General) Act 1999 commences.
- The amendment revises the expiry date of a consequential amendment to the Duties Act 1999 from 1 December 1999, to 2 years after the commencement of the Road Transport (General) Act 1999.
- 3. The amendment revises the expiry date of a consequential amendment to the *Duties Act 1999* from 1 December 1999, to 2 years after the commencement of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999*.

- 4. The amendment inserts a consequential amendment to the *Emergency* Management Act 1999 to reflect that Part V of the Motor Traffic Act 1936 is now contained in Part 10 (Compulsory vehicle insurance) of the Road Transport (General) Act 1999.
- 5. The amendment inserts in the Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991 a penalty for unlawfully parking a heavy vehicle on residential land.
- The amendment revises the expiry date of a consequential amendment to the Motor Traffic (Alcohol and Drugs) Act 1997 from 1 December 2004, to 5 years after the commencement of the Road Transport (General) Act 1999.
- The amendment revises the expiry date of a consequential amendment to the Motor Traffic (Alcohol and Drugs) Act 1997 from 1 December 2001, to 2 years after the commencement of the Road Transport (General) Act 1999.
- The amendment revises the definition of 'offence of culpable driving' contained in Motor Traffic (Alcohol and Drugs) Act 1997 to be consistent with the definition in the Road Transport (General) Act 1999.
