ROAD TRANSPORT (THIRD PARTY INSURANCE) REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

SUBORDINATE LAW No. 5 OF 2000

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Overview

The Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2000 have been amended to insert provisions to allow for continuous registration. As a consequence, amendments are also made to the Road Transport (Third Party Insurance) Regulations 2000 to provide that if a vehicle is continuously registered, the third party insurance premium is calculated from the previous registration expiry date.

Detail

- 1. New regulation 11A applies to third party policies where the registration has expired and the registration is to be renewed after the registration expiry date.
- 2. The maximum premium charged in this situation is the same as the maximum premium that would have been charged had the premium been paid before the registration expired.
- 3. This 'backdating' of the premium to the previous registration expiry date does not apply to a seasonal vehicle.
- 4. The power to make these regulations is found under section 214 (2) of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999*.
