EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Overview

The Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Regulations 2000 have been amended to insert provisions to allow for continuous registration and to streamline the process for renewing vehicle registration. As a consequence, amendments are made to the Road Transport (Offences) Regulations 2000 to insert two new short descriptions and penalty provisions. Further, the short description of an offence in Part 14 of Schedule 1 is reworded.

Detail

- 1. The short description for an offence under section 22 (1) (a) of the *Road Transport* (Vehicle Registration) Act 1999 is reworded. The substitution makes it clearer that the offence is for using a vehicle with a registration label or numberplate that has not been properly issued or is false.
- 2. Part 15 of Schedule 1 is amended to insert an offence provision for using an unissued registration certificate for the purpose of pretending to be registered. A second offence, which is an infringement notice offence, is inserted for the offence of attaching an unissued registration label to a vehicle.
- 3. The power to make these regulations amendments is found under section 233 of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999*.
