### EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The object of this Regulation is to incorporate the *Australian Road Rules* into the law of the Australian Capital Territory (Part 2) and to make other provision with respect to road rules on roads and road related areas in this Territory.

The Australian Road Rules are not completely self-contained and need to be read with associated laws of each jurisdiction.

Many of the Rules provide for "another law of this jurisdiction" to define terms used in the Rules for the purposes of application of the Rules in the Australian Capital Territory, to permit things to be done in the Australian Capital Territory otherwise prohibited by the Rules or to exempt persons in the Australian Capital Territory from compliance with the Rules.

Part 2.3 sets out some of the associated laws that are particular to the Australian Capital Territory.

Part 3.1 provide for the establishment and operation of various parking Schemes and is a reflection of the current schemes.

Part 3.1.3 repeats the heavy vehicle parking scheme that previously existed under the Motor Traffic Act 1936.

Part 3.2 provides for the issue of parking permits and mobility parking scheme authorities.

Part 4 deals with Traffic Offence Detection Devices.

Part 5 covers miscellaneous matters including the disposal of impounded and forfeited vehicles.

These Regulations are made under the Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Act 1999.
