CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE REGULATIONS 2000

SUBORDINATE LAW No. 41 of 2000

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Children and Young People Act 1999 commenced operation on 10 May 2000. The purpose of the Act is to reform the law relating to children and young people in certain key areas.

Pursuant to section 417 of the Act the Executive may make regulations for the purposes of the Act.

Regulation 4 provides for the purposes of section 133 a transitional regulation to recognise and continue previous agreements concerning children and young people held in custody interstate pursuant to ACT orders.

Regulation 5 prescribes the information that must be contained within an application to register a family group conference agreement pursuant to section 175 (3) of the Act.

Regulation 6 prescribes the information that must be contained within an application for a warrant under section 270 (2).

Regulation 7 inserts a new section 425A pursuant to section 445 of the Act. The provision continues existing agreements and arrangements concerning interstate transfer for children and young people.
