The Land (Planning and Environment) (Amendment) Bill 1997 amends the Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991 in two respects

First it corrects a drafting error in s 276(1)(b) which was inserted by the Land (Planning and Environment) (Amendment) Act (No 3) 1996. The proposed amendment replaces the word "rights" with the word "interests". That means that third party objectors will be able to apply to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal if their interests are substantially and adversely affected by the relevant decision rather than requiring that their rights be substantially and adversely affected

Second it inserts provisions that allow any person to bring civil proceedings in the Supreme Court to enforce the Act This implements a recommendation of the Inquiry into ACT Leasehold Administration that there be a civil enforcement provision with open standing inserted in the Act. An open standing provision relating to judicial review under the Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1989 of decisions under the Act was repealed by the Land (Planning and Environment) (Amendment) Act (No 3) 1996.

CLAUSE NOTES

PART I - PRELIMINARY

Clauses 1 and 2 - Short Title, Commencement - are machinery provisions that specify the short title of the Bill and provide for the commencement of the Bill

Clause 3 - Principal Act - identifies the Act being amended.

PART II - AMENDMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL ACT

Clause 4 - Review—objectors, third parties - amends section 276(1)(b) by deleting the word "rights" and inserting the word "interests".

Clause 5 - New Sections - inserts ss 284A-284C allowing for any person to seek an order in the Supreme Court to restrain or remedy a breach of the Act The Act is defined to include a lease in force under the Act, an approval granted under the Act and the conditions attached to such an approval
