UNCOLLECTED GOODS (CONSEQUENTIAL AMENDMENTS) BILL 1996

OUTLINE

The objectives of this Bill are to amend certain Acts and deal with the immediate issues consequent upon the introduction of the *Uncollected Goods Bill 1996* This Bill amends the *Auctioneers Act 1959*, the *Mercantile Law Act 1962*, the *Protection of Lands Act 1937* and the *Public Baths and Public Bathing Act 1956*

Details of the Bill are as follows.

PART I—PRELIMINARY

Short title and Commencement

Clauses 1 & 2

Clauses 1 and 2 are formal requirements Clause 1 refers to the short title of the Bill, and clause 2 sets 1 the date of commencement of the Bill as being the date the Act is notified in the Gazette

PART II - CONSEQUENTIAL PROVISIONS

Amendment of the Auctioneers Act 1959

Clause 3

This clause amends section 4 of the Auctioneers Act 1959 by removing the provision deeming the sale of uncollected goods as not being the business of an auctioneer

Interpretation

Clause 4

Section 22 of the Mercantile Act 1962 is amended by requiring that a warehouseman must issue a notice to sell Sections 23, 24, 25, 26 and 27 of that Act are also repealed

Amendment of the Protection of Lands Act 1937

Clause 5

This clause repeals sections 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 of the *Protection of Lands Act 1937* which relates to the declaration of a retention area, the granting of power to remove items from Teiritory land and place those items in a retention area. Those sections also gave the Territory the power to hold items in a retention area and publish a notice relating to items held and have an application for the return of those items. These powers are now provided in Part II, Division 4 of the *Uncollected Goods Bill 1996*

Amendment of the Public Baths and Public Bathing Act 1956.

Clause 6

This clause repeals Part IV of the Public Baths and Public Bathing Act 1956 Provisions relating to goods found at public baths are found within Part II, Division 3 of the Uncollected Goods Bill 1996

PART III - TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

Interpretation

Clause 7

This clause defines terms that are to be used in Part III

"Commencement date" is the date on which the Uncollected Goods Bill 1996 commences operation

"Old scheme Act" means Finance Regulations and the Mercantile Law Act 1962 as in force before the Uncollected Goods Bill 1996 commences operation, the Protection of Lands Act 1937 and the Public Baths and Public Bathing Act 1956

Goods held by possessors before commencement

Clause 8

This clause permits a person who is in possession of goods before the commencement of the *Uncollected Goods Bill 1996* of the option of taking action either under that Act or the old scheme Act which covered the field and was applicable before the commencement of *Uncollected Goods Bill 1996*

Goods lost or abandoned at public baths

Clause 9

This clauses ensures that a declaration of a retention area that was made under section 9 of *Protection of Lands Act 1937* will continue in effect under clause 14 of the Uncollected Goods Bill 1996

Lost property register

Clause 10

This clause ensures that the Lost Property Register that was kept under section 24 of the Public Baths and Public Bathing Act 1956 will continue to be the lost property register under the Uncollected Goods Bill 1996
