EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Medical Board of the ACT is established under section 7 of the Medical Practitioners Act 1931 and comprises a chairperson, six medical practitioner members and two community representatives. The chairperson and three of the medical practitioners are appointed by the Minister in accordance with the Health Professions Boards (Procedures) Act 1981 and three medical practitioner members are elected by members of the profession registered in the ACT in accordance with the Health Professions Boards (Elections) Act 1980. The two community representatives must not be entitled to be registered by a Board within the meaning of the Procedures Act or under the Dental Technicians and Dental Prosthetists Act 1988. One of the community representatives is to be a legal practitioner.

The Act provides for the registration of suitably qualified medical practitioners, to enable them to practice in the ACT.

Ms Chenoweth has a background with the Social Security Appeals Tribunal, is a current member of the NSW Consumer Trading and Tenancy Tribunal and is presently studying for a graduate Bachelor of Law degree.
