EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Under section 12 of the *Liquor Act 1975* (the Act), the Liquor Licensing Board (the board) is constituted by a chairperson appointed by the minister, the registrar of Liquor Licences and three other members appointed by the minister. Section 13 of the Act requires that the minister shall not appoint a person to be the chairperson unless the person has been a lawyer for not less than five years. Members other than the registrar hold office on a part-time basis for such period as specified in the instrument of appointment.

The board is a body established under Part 2 of the Act to promote and encourage responsibility in the sale and consumption of liquor by considering and determining applications or other matters referred to it; conducting inquiries including formal hearings in relation to applications or other matters referred to it; advising the minister, as required, on matters of policy and administration; and exercising the other functions given to it.

The signed Disallowable Instrument appoints Mr Peter Conway as a member of the board, commencing on the date that the instrument comes into effect and ending on 31 December 2008.

Mr Conway is not a public servant. The Standing Committee on Legal Affairs (the committee) has therefore been consulted as required under the provisions of the *Legislation Act 2001*. The committee has no comment about this appointment.
