## **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT**

## **Purpose of the Code**

The Electricity Metering Code (this Code) requires electricity distributors to supply, install and maintain metering equipment in a safe and reliable manner.

## **Legislative Provisions**

This Code is a technical code under part 5 of the *Utilities Act 2000* (the Act). The Act provides a regulatory framework for utility licence holders in the Australian Capital Territory. Part 5 of the Act is technical regulation. In section 65 of the Act, provisions for making technical codes apply provisions for making industry codes in part 4 of the Act with relevant variations.

#### **Revocation and Determination**

This Disallowable Instrument revokes the Electricity Metering Code (August 2003) and determines the Utilities (Electricity Metering Code) Determination 2015.

## **Outline**

This Code applies to electricity distributors. Due to the introduction of the *National Energy Retail Law (ACT) Act* 2012 this Code no longer applies to electricity suppliers. NERL retailers and NERL exempt sellers replaced electricity suppliers under the *National Energy Retail Law (ACT) Act* 2012.

This Code requires electricity distributors to comply with relevant technical standards and guidelines. It refers to the National Energy Market Metrology Procedures made under chapter 7 of the *National Electricity Rules*.

## Consultation

In accordance with section 65 of the Act, the Minister consulted the Independent Competition and Regulatory Commission and the relevant utility to create this Code.
