Architects Board Appointment 2017 (No 2)

Disallowable instrument DI2017-204

made under the

Architects Act 2004, Subsection 70(2)

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This disallowable instrument appoints members to the Australian Capital Territory Architects Board (the Board) for a period not longer than three years.

Section 64 of the Act provides for the establishment of the Board. The functions of the Board are to:

- register architects;
- investigate complaints about registered people and people who have been registered;
- take disciplinary action where necessary;
- consider and report to the Minister about issues referred to the Board by the Minister;
- advise the Minister in relation to the practice of architecture;
- further common legislative approach through cooperation with other jurisdictions;
- accredit courses of study in architecture; and
- provide general advice to consumers about professional conduct and standards of competence expected to registered architects.

Under section 66 the Board must exercise its functions independently, impartially and in the public interest. However the Board is still required to respond to Ministerial directions to the Board.

Section 70 of the Act requires the Minister to appoint five members to the Board.

Section 70 stipulates the requirements for each position:

- one member must be, nominated in writing by a representative body;
- one member must be, or have recently been an academic architect:
- one member must be a registered architect;
- one member must be a commercial lawyer; and

 one member is to represent community interests, and must not be a registered architect.

Under Section 71, the appointments are for a period not longer than three years. None of the appointments to the Board are ACT Public Servants.

Members of the Board are paid for sitting hours only at a maximum rate of \$435 for members and \$510 for the chairperson.

In accordance with section 228 of the Legislation Act 2001 the appointments were referred to the Legislative Assembly Standing Committee on Planning and Urban Renewal. The Committee had no comment regarding the appointment.
