Remuneration Tribunal (Fees and Allowances of Members) Determination 2022

Disallowable instrument DI2022–226

made under the

Remuneration Tribunal Act 1995, section 20 (Determination of fees and allowances of members)

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Legislative Context

The *Remuneration Tribunal Act 1995* (the Act) established the Remuneration Tribunal (the Tribunal). The Tribunal may be constituted by the appointment of one member and may consist of not more than three members. Where more than one member is appointed, a member is appointed to be the chairperson.

Under section 20 of the Act, the Chief Minister may determine the fees and allowances payable to members of the Tribunal.

Background

The remuneration increase maintains appropriate relativity with similar part-time public office holders in the ACT public sector, and to some extent, with similar tribunals elsewhere in Australia.

Decision

This instrument adjusts the level of remuneration payable to the members of the Tribunal to the following amounts:

- Chair: \$32,310 per annum; and
- Members: \$19,390 per annum.

This instrument further adjusts the remuneration payable to the members of the Tribunal from the dates of effect to the following amounts:

Office	Remuneration (Effective 1 October 2018)	Remuneration (Effective 1 October 2019)
Chairperson	\$30,900	\$31,675
Other Members	\$18,540	\$19,005

The members of the Tribunal are entitled to back payment of the difference in remuneration following the increase to the amount payable only if the increase covers time during their appointment.

Other entitlements and allowances are consistent with all other ACT Part-time Public Office Holders.
