REVOCATION AND DETERMINATION OF FEES

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

INSTRUMENT No. 140 OF 1999

This Determination made under section 52A of the Surveyors Act 1967 (the Act) revokes the existing Determination of Fees and sets the fees for the purposes of the Act.

The combined fee for annual registration to cover registration within both the ACT and NSW juristrictions was set in 1998 at \$400. This fee represents 75% of the combined individual fees for 1998-99. As NSW are yet to determine a fee for 1999-00 the combined fee at this stage is unknown but will be calculated in line with current agreements as 75% of the combined individual fees. This joint registration fee is now expressed at 75% of the combined individual fees. The ACT will retain only its proportion of the fee which will be 75% of \$280. The balance being 75% of the NSW fee will be keep by NSW. The fee is expected to be \$448, based on the expectation that NSW has an annual registration for 1999-00 of \$360. In effect both the ACT and NSW will receive 75% of the normal registration from those surveyors who register in both juristicitions. This continues last years practice and therefore there are no revenue implications.

The remaining fees have increased as a result of CPI adjustments in accordance with Government policy.
