## AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY MOTOR TRAFFIC ACT 1936 DETERMINATION OF TAXI FARES Instrument No. 118 of 1998 EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This instrument revokes the previous taxi fare determination under the Motor Traffic Act 1936, namely -

Determination No 148 of 1997 dated 19 June 1997 and published in the ACT Gazette No S206 of 1 July 1997

Taxi fares are regulated under Section 36(1) of the Motor Traffic Act 1936 which specifies that the Minister may, by notice published in the Gazette, determine the maximum fares chargeable for the hiring of a taxi. This notice is a disallowable instrument in the Legislative Assembly

This determination reflects an increase in the maximum taxi fares payable by 2.27% for the ACT. The last fare increase was implemented on 1 July 1997. The new fares which are set out below will take effect from 1 July 1998. The old fares are shown in brackets, this determination makes no change to the fees for Flagfall, Waiting Time, Radio Booking or High Occupancy Surcharge.

## HIGH OCCUPANCY SURCHARGE

For the carriage of a group of 6 or more passengers to a common hiring destination, that is not the subject of a multiple hiring, the maximum fare is the single rate plus fifty per cent (50%) of that rate.
