VARIATION TO ACT FIRST AID IN THE WORKPLACE CODE OF PRACTICE

NO. 100 OF 1997

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Section 87(1) of the ACT Occupational Health and Safety Act 1989 provides that the Minister can approve a codes of practice or a variation to a code of practice for the purpose of providing practical guidance to employers, selfemployed persons and employees.

This Instrument is written pursuant to Section 87 of the Act.

The ACT First Aid in the Workplace Code of Practice – was approved in 1994 in accordance with Section 87(2) of the ACT Occupational Health and Safety Act 1989. The ACT Occupational Health and Safety Council has recommended that the Code be varied to exclude Paracetamol from the list of items required to be included in a basic first aid kit.

The Council has made this recommendation because Paracetamol is not used in rendering first aid but is used as a form of medical treatment and therefore is inappropriate to a first aid kit. The Council also expressed concern about Paracetamol abuse and concern that its use could mask more serious illnesses requiring proper medical treatment.
