Electricity and Water Act 1988

DETERMINATIONS

Determination:

The Australian Capital Territory Electricity and Water Authority (ACTEW) in pursuance of section 48 of the *Electricity and Water Act 1988*, has made the following determination fixing the charges that are to be payable to ACTEW for, or in connection with the supply of electricity, with effect from 1 September 1989

1. General

- 1.1 This Determination prescribes the monetary rates of charges that are payable to the Authority for or in connection with the supply of electricity to consumers
- 1.2 Meter readings (other than readings taken at the termination of supply) shall be taken to the nearest ten kilowatt hours
- 1.3 The charge applicable for supply to each installation shall be in accordance with the following classification of premises, places and purposes.

- 1.3.1 **Domestic charge** shall be applicable to installations at dwellings including dwellings subsidiarily used for medical or dental practice, residential convents and charitable homes; boarding schools, churches used for public worship; and public light and power in these premises,

1.3.2 **Farm charge** shall be applicable to installations at premises or properties used mainly for primary production,

1.3.3 **Community services charge** shall be applicable to installations at premises or properties which are used wholly or principally for community benefit and which are owned or operated by non-profit organisations. Organisations covered by this rate are scout and guide halls, community halls and church halls used by non-profit organisations; centres for the use of the aged, infirm, destitute or physically handicapped, but not including educational institutions and hospitals;

1.3.4 **General charge** shall be applicable to installations not included in the preceding subparagraphs, 'Domestic Charge', 'Farm Charge' and 'Community Services Charge', provided that special rates shall be applicable to particular premises and appliances as hereinafter provided, and for special apparatus or equipment wherever located,

1.3.5 **Off-peak charge 1** shall be applicable to water heater storage units with 2 elements in residential dwellings.

- Units must be approved, permanently installed units, for which a certificate has been issued indicating compliance with AS 1056, with twin elements, and is restricted to a total of six hours within any one day, between 2200 hrs (10 00 p.m.) and 0700 hrs (7.00 a.m.) The actual settings on the time switch will be nominated by the Authority. Times referred to are Australian Eastern Standard Time.
- Rated delivery shall be not less than 250 litres;
- Elements must be interlocked, ie not simultaneous operation. The top booster element will be available during the high demand period during the day if required;
- This charge applies to single unit residential premises, ie separately metered, self-contained private dwellings supplied at domestic charge.
- Minimum storage of water heaters.

1.3.6 **Off-peak charge 2** shall be applicable to

- Water heating storage units with 1 element in residential dwellings. (two element water heaters can also be connected but top element will have to be connected to domestic charge); water heating storage units must be permanently installed not less than 160 litre rated delivery, for which a test certificate has been issued indicating compliance with AS 1056;
- Water heating storage units where electricity is used to supplement other forms of energy (e.g. solar);
- Controlled space heating including under floor concrete slab designed with adequate capacity;

- Space heating units for this charge should have controlled outputs as no boosting periods during the day are allowed

- times of operation will be restricted to six hours in any one day, between 2200 hrs (10.00 p.m.) to 0700 hrs (7.00 a.m.) The actual settings on the time switch will be nominated by the Authority. Times referred to are Australian Eastern Standard Time. No boosting during high or moderate demand times during the day will be allowed unless booster elements connected to domestic charge are fitted;

- Charge only applies to single unit residential premises, i.e. separately metered, self-contained private dwellings supplied at the domestic charge;

1.3.7 **Off-peak charge 3**

Off-peak water heating shall be applicable to approved, permanently installed storage water heaters for which a test certificate has been issued indicating compliance with Australian Standard 1056 and where consumption is restricted to a total of thirteen hours in any one day. The said thirteen hours shall be comprised of eight hours between 2000 hrs (8 00 p.m.) and 0700 hrs (7.00 a.m.) and five hours between 0900 hrs (9.00 a.m.) and 1700 hours (5 00 p.m.) The actual settings on the time switch will be nominated by the Authority. Times referred to are in Australian Eastern Standard Time. Rated delivery shall not be less than 160 litres and the element rating shall not exceed 3.6 kW for units with rated delivery up to and including 250 litres. For larger tanks the element shall not exceed 15.25 watts per litre of rated delivery. Booster elements are not permitted. This charge shall only apply when used in conjunction with domestic, farm, community services or general charge (this option available to existing off-peak water heating customers only);

Supplementary off-peak water heating shall be applicable only to approved, permanently installed storage water heaters where electricity is used to supplement other forms of energy and where consumption is restricted to a total of thirteen hours in any one day. The said thirteen hours shall be comprised of eight hours between 2000 hrs (8.00 p.m.) and 0700 hrs (7.00 a.m.) and five hours between 0900 hrs (9.00 a.m.) and 1700 hours (5.00 p.m.) The actual settings on the time switch will be nominated by the authority. Times referred to are in Australian Eastern Standard Time. The element rating shall not exceed 3.6 kW for units with rated delivery up to and including 250 litres. For larger tanks the element shall not exceed 15.25 watts per litre of rated delivery. This charge shall only apply when used in conjunction with domestic, farm, community services or general charge (this option available to existing supplementary off-peak water heating customers only);

Off-peak space heating shall be applicable to approved, permanently installed storage space heaters, including under-floor concrete slab heating systems designed with adequate capacity where consumption is restricted to a total of thirteen hours in any one day. The said thirteen hours shall be comprised of eight hours between 2000 hrs (8 00 p.m.) and 0700 hrs (7.00 a.m.) and five hours between 0900 hrs (9.00 a.m.) and 1700 hours (5 00 p.m.)

The actual settings on the time switch will be nominated by the Authority Times referred to are in Australian Eastern Standard time This charge shall only apply when used in conjunction with domestic, farm, community services or general charge (this option available to existing off-peak space heating customers only),

After-hours Outside business hours, Monday to Friday, all day Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays

1.3.8 **Streetlighting charge** shall be applicable to the lighting of streets and public ways and places,

1.3.9 **Temporary supply** (e.g. for building purposes) may be rendered at the discretion of the Authority provided that the Authority shall estimate the cost for single or three phase installation, of installing, dismantling, connecting, disconnecting and inspecting mains, lines and apparatus, the cost so estimated, shall be lodged before connection will be effected, and the rate chargeable for power used shall be at the general charge;

1.3.10 **KVA maximum demand charge.** Subject to an applicant first demonstrating his need for supply, and to installation by him at his premises at his own cost of all necessary equipment together with adequate accommodation for the installation and proper maintenance of that installation all to the satisfaction of the Authority, kVA maximum demand supply may be made available to that installation

1.3.10.1 High voltage maximum demand charge maybe available (existing consumers excluded) to consumers whose maximum demand exceeds 750 kVA in any one month;

1.3.10.2 Low voltage maximum demand charge may be available (existing consumers excluded) to consumers whose maximum demand exceeds 200 kVA in any one month.

1.3.10.3 Low voltage maximum demand charge—Optional by application for large consumers—may be available to consumers whose maximum demand exceeds 20 kVA in any one month

1.3.11 **Potential total system peak period** is defined as from 0730 hours (7.30 a.m.) to 0830 (8.30 a.m.) and from 1715 hours (5.15 p.m.) to 1915 hours (7.15 p.m.) on any day during the whole year with the exception of Saturdays, Sundays and Prescribed Public Holidays

1.3.12 **Winter months** are those defined as consumption periods including the whole of the calendar months of May, June, July and August and billed in the months of June, July, August and September

1.3.13 **Application charge** will apply to all new applications for supply of electricity.

After-hours connection charge. A higher fee applies for applications lodged after 2.30 p.m. on a working day where connection to supply is required prior to next day and for applications lodged after-hours requiring connection prior to business hours on the next working day

Business hours. 8.30 a.m. to 4.45 p.m., Monday to Friday with the exception of Public Holidays
