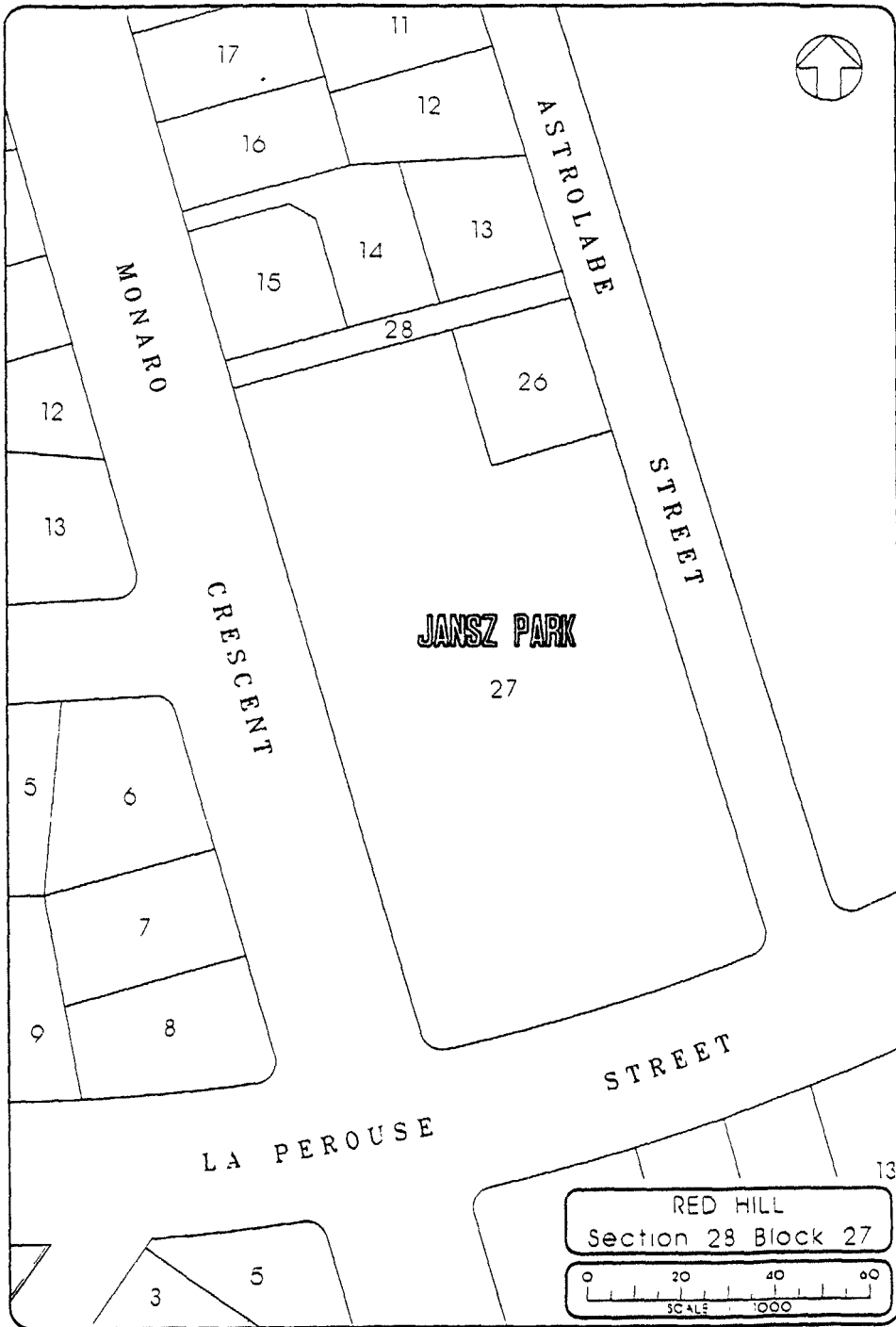
PUBLIC PLACE NOMENCLATURE

Description of the Public Place

The public place is that portion known as Block 27 Section 28 Red Hill.

Origin and Significance of Name

Jansz, Willem (born c.1570), Dutch mariner; first authenticated discoverer of Australia; early 1606 charted some 320 km of the western coast of Cape York Peninsula and made a landing near the Wenlock River, Qld, almost certainly the first by white men in Australia.
