



The ACT Planning Authority is inviting comment on a Land Use Policy change in Griffith.

Pursuant to Part 111 Division 2 of the Interim Planing Act 1990 the ACT Planning Authority has prepared a draft Variation to the Territory Plan for Griffith Section 78 Block 30.

The purpose of the Draft Variation to the Territory Plan is to seek public comment on a proposed change of Land Use Policy for a narrow strip of land at the Griffith shops from Open Space to Commercial Centre Uses.

# INSTRUMENT OF APPROVAL UNDER SECTION 10

Under section 10 of the City Area Leases Act 1936 I CARL JAMES THOMPSON APPROVE of PETER HEAUME ("the Applicant") carrying on the profession trade occupation or calling of HOBBY CERAMICS TEACHER ("the business") on Block 9 Section 46 Division of GIRALANG known as 6 MALINDI PLACE GIRALANG ("the land") subject to the following conditions relating to the use of the land being observed by the Applicant in carrying on the business —

- that this approval will remain valid only while the Applicant continues to be a bona fide resident of the land;

- that the Applicant will ensure that all residence and business related vehicles are parked within the confines of the land and on the existing hard standing driveway;
- 7 that only the approved area be used for the conduct of the business and shall not exceed more than 30 square metres;
- 8 that the business will only be conducted on the land between the hours of 7.00pm and 9.30pm Monday to Thursday and 11.00am and 4.00pm Tuesday to Thursday and 1.00pm and 5.00pm Saturday;

- that the Applicant will not employ more than one assistant for the purpose of conducting or carrying on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- 10 that the Applicant will conduct the business strictly by appointment, and that such appointments will be organised to ensure that no more than four clients are in attendance at any one time;
- 11 that the Applicant will not undertake any retail sales from the premises;
- 12 that the applicant complies at all times with the Water Pollution Act 1984, Air Pollution Act 1984 and the Noise Control Act 1988;
- 13 that this approval will terminate on the THIRTIETH day of SEPTEMBER 1992 or on such earlier date as the Minister determines in accordance with condition 14;
- 14 upon any failure to comply with any or all of the foregoing conditions the Minister or his Delegate under the said Act may give written notice requiring the Applicant to show cause within a period of fourteen days why this approval should not be revoked. At the expiration of this period the Minister or his Delegate may revoke the approval.

## INSTRUMENT OF APPROVAL UNDER SECTION 10

Under section 10 of the City Area Leases Act 1936 I CARL JAMES THOMPSON APPROVE of ELKE BRIGITTE LEIDVOGEL ("the Applicant") carrying on the profession trade occupation or calling of REMEDIAL THERAPIST ("the business") on Block 10 Section 9 Division of WESTON known as 79 Hilder Street Weston ("the land") subject to the following conditions relating to the use of the land being observed by the Applicant in carrying on the business -

- that no person other than the Applicant will conduct or in any way carry on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- 6 that the Applicant will ensure that all residence and business related vehicles are parked within the confines of the land;
- 7 that the Applicant will not employ any assistants for the purpose of conducting or carrying on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- 8 that only the approved area be used for the conduct of the business;
- 9 that the business will only be conducted on the land between the hours of 9.00am and 5.00pm Mondays,

Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and 9.00am and 1.00pm on Wednesdays;

- that the Applicant will conduct the business strickly by appointment, and that such appointments are made to ensure that no more than one client is in attendance at any one time, and that there is a fifteen minute break between the finish of the last appoinment and the commencement of the next;
- 11 that this approval will terminate on the THIRTIETH day of SEPTEMBER 1992 or on such earlier date as the Minister determines in accordance with condition 12;
- 12 upon any failure to comply with any or all of the foregoing conditions the Minister or his Delegate under the said Act may give written notice requiring the Applicant to show cause within a period of fourteen days why this approval should not be revoked. At the expiration of this period the Minister or his Delegate may revoke the approval.
