



- that the Applicant will not employ more than two assistants, one will be employed as a nurse/receptionist and the other will be the wife of the applicant, for the purpose of conducting or carrying on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- 8 that only the approved area be used for the conduct of the business;
- 9 that the business will only be conducted on the land between the hours of 9.00am and 5.00pm Monday to Friday excluding public holidays;
- that the Applicant will conduct the business strictly by appointment, and that such appointments are made to ensure that no more than two clients are in attendance at any one time;
- 11 that this approval will terminate on the THIRTIETH day of SEPTEMBER 1992 or on such earlier date as the Minister determines in accordance with condition 12;

- that the Applicant will conduct the business strictly in accordance with the application made by the Applicant under section 10 of the City Area Leases Act 1936 unless otherwise stipulated in this Instrument;
- 5 that no person other than the Applicant will conduct or in any way carry on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- 6 that the Applicant will ensure that all residence and business related vehicles are parked within the confines of the land;
- 7 that the Applicant will only employ one assistant for the purpose of conducting or carrying on the business on the land without the prior approval of the Minister;
- 8 that only one of the bedrooms and part of the living room in the house be used for the conduct of the business;
- 9 that the business will only be conducted on the land between the hours of 9.00am to 5.00pm, Monday to Friday;
- that the Applicant will conduct the business strictly by appointment, and that such appointments will be organised to ensure that only one visitor will be in attendance at any one time;
- 11 that this approval will terminate on the THIRTIETH day of SEPTEMBER 1992 or on such earlier date as the Minister determines in accordance with condition 12;
