STOCK DISEASES ACT 1933

DECLARATION

NO. 4 of 1992

Under Section 11H(1) of the Stock Diseases ACT 1933 I REVOKE the declaration dated 12 November 1991 and published in the ACT Gazette No 50 on 18 December 1991 and DECLARE the following as the manner in which approved tags shall be attached to defined stock:

1 Cattle including Buffalo, Bull, Cow, Ox, Steer, Heifer or Calf.

(A) A person who attaches a tag to cattle shall fit the tag securely around the tail of the cattle immediately above the brush.

(B) A tag shall be attached to cattle in such a manner that the particulars of identification borne by the tag are clearly visible.

2 Swine.

(A) The swine shall be identified by being tattooed with a carbon-based ink or paste, or similar ink or paste product, using a branding iron or other device supplied by a person authorised in accordance with various State legislations under the Stock Diseases ACT or equivalent.

(B) The ink or paste shall be applied to the characters of the branding iron or other device prior to its application to each of the swine.

(C) The branding iron or other device shall be applied on one of the shoulders;

(D) Where it is applied by a person buying or selling the swine (whether on his own behalf or as agent for another) at a saleyard--somewhere on the swine apart from the shoulders.

(E) The branding iron or other device shall be applied so as to impress the characters of the brand through the skin of the swine.

(F) Swine shall be deemed not to be identified in accordance with this notice if, at the time they are sold, or sent or delivered to an abattoir, as the case may be, the brand upon them is more than 7 days old.


