

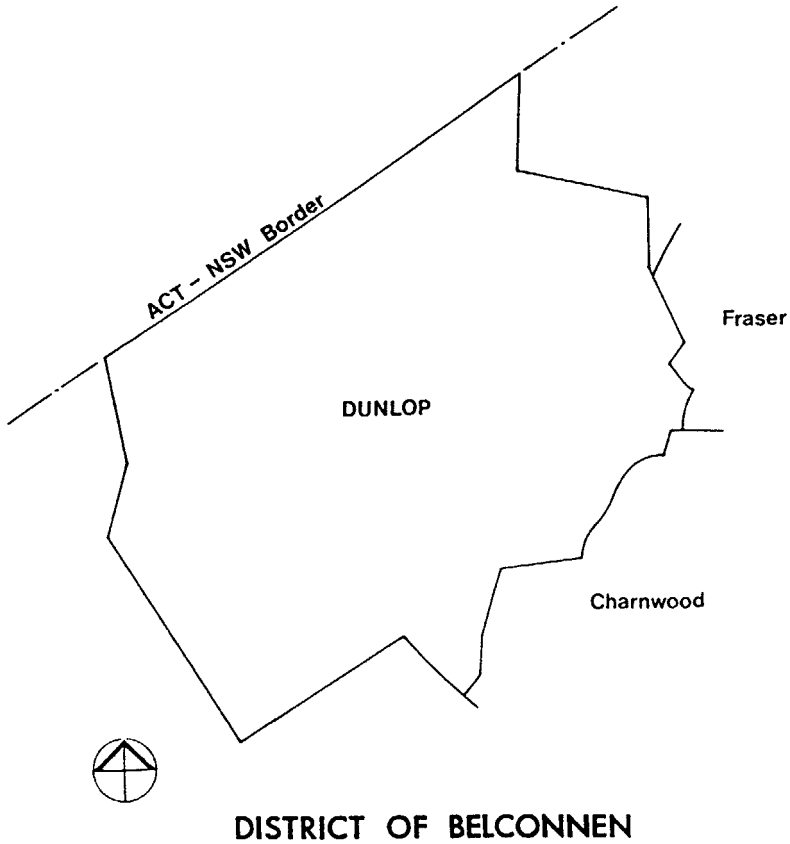

DIVISION NAME WITH REFERENCE TO ORIGIN

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
DUNLOP	Sir Edward (Weary) Dunlop OBE, COA (1907-1993)	Doctor and war veteran. Sir Edward was revered by former POWs both for his exploits as a doctor on the notorious Burma - Thailand railway and for his work among veterans in the post-war years. After the war Dunlop rose to prominence in public life as a surgeon of international standing, a medical researcher specialising in the treatment of tropical diseases and campaigner for a host of organisations and charities. He was awarded an OBE in 1947 and a COA in 1987 and was president of the Alcoholism Foundation of Victoria.



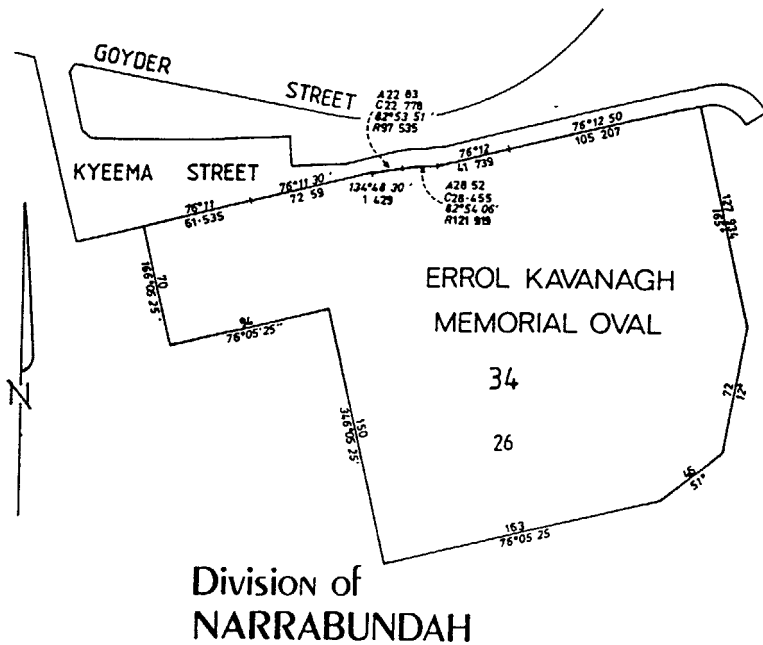

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
ERROL KAVANAGH MEMORIAL OVAL	Errol Martin Kavanagh (1944-1993)	He was born in SA in 1944. In 1962 he joined the RAN and gained his wings two years later, flying the Fairey Gannet Anti-Submarine aircraft. He later converted to A4 Skyhawks and became a Qualified Flying Instructor. His naval career was distinguished and very much operational. He left the RAN as Commander in 1987, and joined Qantas in 1989. For some years he was involved in raising money for the ACT Society for the Physically Handicapped and it was at the 1993 fund raising event that Errol tragically lost his life when the Mig 15 aircraft he was flying crashed.
