
#### ESTABLISHMENT OF A JOINT SELECTION COMMITTEE

## Categories used in this Gazette

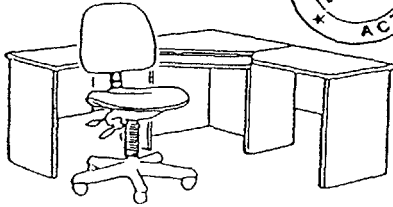
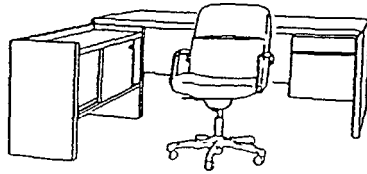

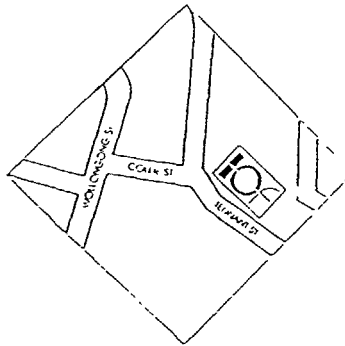
