

Employers are required to submit with their application a statement and any evidence to demonstrate how their circumstances makes it difficult for them to keep on their apprentice.

Apprenticeship/Trainee Wage Subsidy Scheme Financial assistance to Employers in the Building and Construction Industry to Take On Extra First Year Apprentices/Trainees.

Employers in one of following trades who wish to take on an additional first year apprentice/trainee or take on a first year apprentice/trainee for the first time:

- Bricklaying
- Painting/Decorating
- Plastering
- Signwriting
- · Wall and Floor Tiling
- · Plant/machine operators

These trades are those in the Building and Construction industry identified as having a reduced supply of apprentices over the period 1998 to 2003.

Subsides are available for only an extra 25 first year apprentices/trainees in these trades.

A subsidy of 50% of the salary and on costs of taking on a new apprentice or trained is provided (\$7,500). Half is provided to the employer three months after commencement and remainder of the subsidy after the apprentice/trained has been retained in full time employment or formal training for three months after the first year level of competency has been attained.


