MILK AUTHORITY OF THE AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

MILK AUTHORITY ACT 1971

The Milk Authority of the Australian Capital Territory, in pursuance of section 16A of the Milk Authority Act 1971, fixes and determines as follows:

1. This notice takes effect on 8/1/97
2. Any previous instrument or determination fixing the prices at which milk may be sold in the Jervis Bay Territory is, to that extent, hereby revoked
3. The maximum price at which whole milk, skim milk or modified milk packaged in containers of various kinds may be sold by retail by a milk vendor to consumers in the Jervis Bay Territory is fixed and declared to be the corresponding price determined by the New South Wales Dairy Corporation pursuant to the *Dairy Industry Act 1979* (NSW) for the sale by retail of that kind of milk packaged in that kind of container in New South Wales
4. The maximum price at which whole milk, skim milk or modified milk packaged in containers of various kinds may be sold by distributors to shop-retailers in the Jervis Bay Territory is fixed and declared to be the corresponding price determined by the New South Wales Dairy Corporation pursuant to the *Dairy Industry Act 1979* (NSW) for the sale by distributors to shop-retailers of that kind of milk packaged in that kind of container in New South Wales.
5. References in this notice to prices determined by the New South Wales Dairy Corporation shall be read as including any relevant determination by that Corporation in relation to rounding prices to the nearest 5 or 10 cents.
6. No price is fixed or determined for the sale in the Jervis Bay Territory of flavoured milk or the modified milk product packaged in 2 litre bottles labelled as *Cappuccino Plus*. References to milk in paragraphs 3 and 4 of this notice shall be read as excluding milk of the kinds referred to in this paragraph
