Electrical Equipment and Hardware, Household Appliances (17)

Computer software (off-the-shelf) (see Code 27); audio equipment; radio and television receivers; refrigerators and house-hold appliances; water heaters; batteries; electric and telephone cable and wire; lighting equipment; solar panels and wind generators

Computer, Office Equipment and Electrical Equipment NEC (18)

Computers and peripherals (purchase and lease); electronic office machines (see also Code 16); satellites; radio and television transmitting equipment; television cameras; picture tubes and studio equipment; navigational aids; semi-conductors; telephones and switch-boards; X-ray equipment, printed circuit boards

Industrial Machinery and Equipment (19)

The Department of Health and Community Care is seeking expressions of interest from organisations interested in tendering for projects which will result in better sexual health and the prevention of blood-borne diseases for people in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities of the ACT and surrounding areas The nominated priority issues are sexual health education and education or safe behaviours for young people.

Projects may focus on education, prevention, treatment and/or care strategies. Cultural appropriateness and evidence of support from local Aboriginal communities will be taken into account in the assessment of submissions Preference will be given to projects which include significant involvement and/or management by local Aboriginal controlled organisations. This may include the submission of joint projects between Aboriginal community organisations and specialist non-Aboriginal organisations which will result in skills and knowledge transfer.

The Department is actively encouraging the submission of joint projects between Aboriginal based community organisations and specialist non-aboriginal organisations services with a view to the exchange of ideas and specialised knowledge.

Projects may be delivered over a negotiated timeframe of up to 18 months. Funding of up to \$73,000 is available.
