DRAFT VARIATION NO.78 TO THE TERRITORY PLAN - HERITAGE PLACES
REGISTER - THIRD VARIATION

The Planning and Land Management Group (PALM) of the Department of Urban Services (incorporating the ACT Planning Authority), is proposing a draft Variation which, if adopted, would enter a further six places into the Heritage Places Register. The Heritage Places Register is included at Appendix V of the Territory Plan Written Statement. The first places were entered onto the Register in December 1994 when Variation Number 26 came into effect. The Register was further expanded in September 1996 with Variation Number 56.

Draft Variation No.78 to the Territory Plan proposes to enter the following six additional places onto the Heritage Places Register:

28. Aboriginal Chert Quarries (C1/1, C1/2 and C1/3), Gungahlin;
29. The Brassey Hotel (Brassey House),
30. Free Serbian Orthodox Church and Murals, Parish of St George, Canberra,
31. Huntly;
32. Melbourne and Sydney Buildings; and
33. Tuggeranong Boundary Marker Complex

This draft Variation is to have interim effect under the provision of section 9 of the Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991 for the "defined period".
