Draft variations No.209 and 226 to the Territory Plan have been prepared by the ACT Planning and Land Authority in accordance with section 19 of the *Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991* (the Act).

Draft variation No.209 proposes to extend the Mount Mugga Mugga Nature Reserve at East O'Malley by varying the land use policies and by reserving the land as public land.

Draft variation No.226 proposes to add a map overlay to Block 2 Section 22 Phillip that will have the effect of ensuring that a publicly accessible 50 metre swimming pool shall be part of any redevelopment of the site.

Copies of written comments received including those from the National Capital Authority, will be made available for public inspection during normal office hours for a period of 15 business days after the closing date for comments at the ACTPLA Customer Service Centre.

Under section 9 of the Act this draft plan variation has interim effect until **11 December 2004** or earlier if:

- the draft variation comes into effect; or
- the approved plan variation is rejected by the Legislative Assembly; or
- the draft variation is withdrawn.

Interim effect means that the provisions of the draft plan variation are to be treated as though they were actually part of the Territory Plan. Where there is an inconsistency between a provision of the draft plan variation and a comparable provision in the Territory Plan, the more onerous provision shall apply.

Section 11 of the Act does not apply because the variation does not vary the heritage places register.
