1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Emergencies (Service Provider) Approval 2015 (No 10)*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences 4 January 2016.

3 Approval

I approve **Southern Cross Motorsport Fire & Rescue** (the approved provider) to provide fire and rescue services (the services) during Summernats 2016 (the event) in the ACT from 4 January 2016 to 11 January 2016.

4 Conditions on Approval

I impose the conditions in Schedule 1 on the approval.

SCHEDULE 1

Conditions on Motorsport Safety & Rescue Pty Ltd approval under section 62(4) of the *Emergencies Act 2004*

1. The approved provider may only perform the services within the geographical boundaries for the event as defined by Diagram 1 of this Schedule.
2. This instrument approves only the staff nominated by the approved provider in its application for approval under Section 62 of the *Emergencies Act 2004*.
3. Staff not nominated in the application for approval may only provide services with the written approval of the Emergency Services Agency Commissioner.
4. The approved provider must provide the Emergency Services Agency Commissioner with copies of any updated or renewed insurance documentation if insurance is renewed or varied during the approval period.
5. The approved provider may only respond to fires and rescues within the event precinct including:
 - Rubbish bin fires;
 - Minor grass fires;
 - Carburettor fires in vehicles;
 - Minor vehicle fires;
 - Minor vehicle fires (rubber and transmission fires) during burn-out competition;
 - Assisting drivers and passengers from vehicles if the vehicle has been involved in an accident;
 - Assisting drivers and passengers from vehicles if the vehicle has stopped at the burn-out competition; and
 - Provide access to the driver, for first aid services, in the event of an accident.
6. The approved provider may respond to and deal with the cleanup of oil or fuel spills during the event.
7. The approved provider must immediately notify Triple Zero (000) of any incident that is beyond their capability to respond to.
