1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Emergencies (Service Provider) Approval 2016 (No 1)*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences 7 February 2016.

3 Approval

I approve **Firechase ACT** (the approved provider) to provide fire and rescue services (the services) during the 2016 Fairbairn Hill Climb motorsports season (the events) in the ACT, on the following listed dates:

- a) Sunday 7 February 2016
- b) Sunday 21 February 2016
- c) Sunday 20 March 2016
- d) Sunday 3 April 2016
- e) Sunday 1 May 2016
- f) Sunday 5 June 2016
- g) Sunday 14 August 2016
- h) Sunday 25 September 2016
- i) Sunday 16 October 2016
- j) Sunday 20 November 2016

4 Conditions on Approval

SCHEDULE 1

Conditions on Firechase ACT approval under section 62(4) of the *Emergencies Act 2004*

1. The approved provider may only perform the services within the geographical boundaries for the events as defined by Diagram 1 of this Schedule.
2. This instrument approves only the staff nominated by the approved provider in its application for approval under section 62 of the *Emergencies Act 2004*.
3. Staff not nominated by the approved provider in its application for approval under section 62 of the *Emergencies Act 2004* may only provide the services with the written approval of the Emergency Services Agency Commissioner.
4. The approved provider must provide the Emergency Services Agency Commissioner with copies of any updated or renewed insurance documentation if insurance is renewed or varied before this instrument expires.
5. Firechase ACT may only respond to low level fire and rescue incidents including:
 - rubbish bin fires;
 - carburettor fires in vehicles;
 - minor vehicle fires;
 - assist driver from vehicle if the vehicle has been involved in an accident;
and
 - provide access to the driver, for first aid services, in the event of an accident.
6. The approved provider may respond to and deal with the cleanup of oil or fuel spills during the events.
7. The approved provider must immediately notify Triple Zero (000) of any incident that is beyond their capability to respond to.
