Australian Consumer Law (ACT) (Decorative Alcohol Fuelled Burners) Extended Interim Ban 2017 (No 1)

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Australian Consumer Law (ACT) (Decorative Alcohol Fuelled Burners) Extended Interim Ban 2017 (No 1)*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 21 February 2017.

3 Interim Ban

I impose an extension to the interim ban in the Australian Capital Territory on devices designed for domestic use producing a flame using alcohol as fuel, primarily for decorative purpose, excluding the following:

- Those with a power output of more than 4.5 kW;
- Those that require installation in a fixed position; and
- Those designed for food warming.

4 Interpretation

Devices designed for domestic use producing a flame using alcohol as fuel, primarily for decorative purpose are used for heating and display purposes. The fuel is typically ethanol in liquid or (less commonly) gel form. The most common form is methylated spirits (ethanol and around 10% methanol) which may also be marketed as bio-ethanol or eco-fuel.
