1 Name of instrument

ACT CORRECTIVE SERVICES



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1 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

ACT Corrective Services (ACTCS) is committed to providing appropriate care and support to detainees who are identified as 'at risk' of suicide or self-harm.

2 SCOPE

This policy applies to ACT correctional centres.

3 PRINCIPLES

The following principles apply:

- ACTCS manages the prevention of suicide and self-harm in custody as a key priority, and
 has implemented an integrated approach consistent with legislative requirements to
 manage at risk detainees.
- Suicide is a complex problem and requires a multidisciplinary approach. All employees
 will adopt a team approach and work together to share information, knowledge and
 skills in assessing and managing detainees.
- ACTCS is conscious that early identification and notification of 'at risk' detainees is an
 essential element of ensuring detainees' safety and wellbeing while in custody.
- Upon admission to an ACT correctional centre, detainees are assessed within 24 hours to establish a risk rating and identify any issues that could render them vulnerable and at risk.
- ACTCS staff are appropriately trained to promptly identify and manage at risk detainees.
- Staff will aim to make decisions on a team basis to enable officers and employees to take justified risks where appropriate.
- ACTCS provides an environment that is conducive to minimising self-harm and mitigates risk to detainees.
- ACTCS aims to provide an environment that minimises stress, loss of dignity, social isolation and all forms of bullying.
- Where appropriate, consideration is given to minimising detainees' isolation and maximising their interaction with others, while maintaining the safety of all parties.
- ACTCS ensures that all detainees are provided with access to appropriate and measured programs and assistance in resolving personal difficulties and crises.
- ACTCS ensures that there are strategies in place to support detainees with special needs and those that are statistically more susceptible to suicide or self-harm.

 ACTCS takes necessary precautions to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all at risk detainees who are being escorted.

• At risk detainees are managed through a framework of assessments and management

strategies, including engagement in ongoing support and intervention.

• ACTCS works collaboratively with ACT Health to assess and care for at risk detainees.

ACTCS shares relevant information with ACT Health to ensure consistent and

appropriate care is provided to detainees.

4 **DEFINITIONS**

At Risk Detainee

A detainee identified or assessed as being at risk of suicide or self-harm, requiring immediate

intervention and management.

Suicide

An unnatural, self-inflicted death in which the person had intent to die.

Self-Harm

The act of injuring oneself with non-fatal consequences. Rather than an attempt by a

detainee to intentionally end their life, self-harm is most often used as a strategy to actually

cope with life and deal with negative emotions such as anger, frustration, depression,

anxiety or fear, hopelessness and loss.
