1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the Corrections Management (Prohibited Things) Declaration 2025.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on the 1st December 2025.

3 Declaration

Pursuant to section 81 of the Corrections Management Act 2007, I declare each item listed in Schedule 1 of this instrument to be a prohibited thing.

4 Revocation

This instrument revokes the *Corrections Management (Prohibited Things) Declaration* 2024 [NI 2024-576].

Prohibited Things Declaration

In accordance with section 145 (1) of the <u>Corrections Management Act 2007</u>, a person commits an offence if they:

- take or send a prohibited thing into a correctional centre
- give or send a prohibited thing to a detainee or
- remove a prohibited thing from a correctional centre.

Approval for a person to have restricted access to certain prohibited things in a correctional centre may be authorised by the ACT Corrective Services (ACTCS) Assistant Commissioner, Custodial Operations (ACCO) in accordance with section 145 (3) of the <u>Corrections Management Act 2007</u> and the <u>Prohibited Things, Restricted, Excess, and Non-Standard Items Operating Procedure.</u>

Pursuant to sections 81 of the <u>Corrections Management Act 2007</u>, the following items are declared as prohibited things:

- Aerosol pressure spray cans
- Alcohol and alcohol-based products (excluding alcohol 'fat-based substances' contained in toiletries, medicines etc.)
- Bags and cases (non-transparent)
- Blu Tack and similar sticking products
- Cable ties
- Cameras or other photographic devices
- Candles
- Chain
- Chewing gum
- Chewing tobacco
- Communication devices
- Currency / Money
- Drones and accessories
- Drugs and drug paraphernalia
- Electronic cigarettes (vapes)
- Electrical items, including but not limited to cables, charging devices, adaptors, and power banks
- Explosives
- Fitness trackers, smart watches and similar devices, including any device with Bluetooth connectivity
- Firearms and ammunition
- Flammable liquids
- Food
- Gang related property and materials
- Glass containers, cups and bottles
- Illicit drugs
- Incense

- Keys
- Knives, parts of knives, folding knives and multi-tools
- Laser pointers
- Laptops
- Lighters
- Locks
- Matches
- Medication (prescribed, nicotine patches, herbal and/or over the counter)
- Metal cutlery and crockery such as water bottles and coffee cups (except where provided by the correctional centre)
- Mobile telephones and accessories
- Multi-media items (videos, DVD's, CD's, Floppy disks)
- Perfumed oils
- Paint
- Recording devices
- Restraint devices
- Restricted publications such as pornography and objectionable material
- Scented oil
- Scissors and nail scissors/clippers
- Smokeless tobacco
- Syringes
- Tattooing materials
- Tobacco, cigarettes, cigars, rolling paper and other similar products, or products containing nicotine (excluding medication)
- Tools (except those on the AMC tool register)
- Umbrellas
- USB storage devices
- Vaporisers, vaping devices, and other similar devices (electronic or e-cigarette) and accessories
- Watches with Wi-Fi, Near Field Communication (NFC), Bluetooth, mobile phone and/or data transfer capability
- Weapons or items crafted to be used as a weapon
- Weights (except where provided by the correctional centre)
