

**Regulations under the Public Health Ordinance
1928-1930.**

I, FRANK ANSTEY, Minister of State for Health, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Home Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930*, and the *Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930*, hereby make the following Regulations to come into operation forthwith.

**PUBLIC HEALTH (MEDICAL AND DENTAL INSPECTION
OF SCHOOL CHILDREN) REGULATIONS.**

Short title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Public Health (Medical and Dental Inspection of School Children) Regulations*.

Definitions.

2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Authorized medical officer” includes an authorized medical practitioner; and

“School” means any premises in or upon which children (or other persons) are assembled for the purpose of instruction.

3. (1.) An authorized medical officer may examine medically and physically any child attending any school, and the child shall submit to, and the parents or guardians of the child shall permit, such examination as the medical officer deems necessary.

Examination of school children.

(2.) Every such medical officer shall carry out the medical and physical examination of every such child in conformity with a schedule, and record the results on a form, approved by the Director-General.

4. (1.) An authorized dentist may examine the teeth of any child attending any school and the child shall submit to, and the parents or guardians of the child shall permit, the examination.

Dental examinations.

(2.) Every such dentist shall carry out the dental examination of any such child in conformity with a schedule, and record the results on a form, approved by the Director-General.

5. The head teacher or person in charge of any school shall carry out such instructions as are given by the authorized medical officer, or authorized dentist, for the purposes of the examination of the children attending the school.

Head teacher to carry out instructions.

6. Any authorized medical officer or authorized nurse who finds that any child attending any school is in an unclean or verminous condition may, by writing, notify the parent or guardian of the child of the fact and require the parent or guardian to remedy the unclean or verminous condition forthwith, and to keep the child clean or free from vermin.

Verminous children.

7. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of these Regulations, or with any instructions or notice given thereunder, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and, where the offence is a continuing offence, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which the offence continues.
