Regulations under the Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930.

I FRANK ANSTEY, Minister of State for Health, acting for and , on behalf of the Minister of State for Home Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930, and the Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930, hereby make the following Regulations to come into operation forthwith.

PUBLIC HEALTH (TUBERCULOSIS) REGULATIONS.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Tuber-short title, culosis) Regulations.
- 2. These Regulations shall be incorporated and read as one with Incorporation, the Public Health (Infectious) Diseases Regulations made under the Public Health Ordinance 1928.
- 3. A medical practitioner shall, in notifying to the Medical Officer Notification of Health any patient suffering or suspected to be suffering from tuberculosis, include in the notification explicit information as to the anatomical site of the disease.
- 4. The Medical Officer of Health may by written order place under surveillance any person suffering from tuberculosis and any person so placed under surveillance shall thereafter, until released, romain under surveillance, and shall carry out such written instructions as are given by the Medical Officer of Health.
