

**Regulations under the Public Health Ordinance
1928-1930.**

I, FRANK ANSTEY, Minister of State for Health, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Home Affairs, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930*, and the *Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930*, hereby make the following Regulations to come into operation forthwith.

**PUBLIC HEALTH (LAUNDRIES, CLEANING
ESTABLISHMENTS AND DYE WORKS) REGULATIONS.**

No. 9.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Laundries, Cleaning Establishments and Dye Works) Regulations. Short title.

2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.

“Approved” means approved by the Director-General or by an authorized officer;

“Premises” means any premises used for the purpose of a laundry, cleaning establishment or dye works;

“Proprietor” includes the owner, or any person having the management or control of any laundry, cleaning establishment or dye works.

3. Every proprietor shall cause all the liquid wastes produced upon the premises to be collected and conducted by impervious channels or drains to a trapped drain inlet or some approved receptacle or disposed of in an approved manner. Disposal of liquid wastes.

4. Every proprietor shall cause every floor or pavement and every wall of any building upon the premises to be kept at all times in good order and repair so as to prevent the absorption in any such floor, pavement or wall of any liquid thereon. Floor, &c., to be kept in good repair.

Discharging water from mouth prohibited. 5. The proprietor of a laundry or any of his employees shall not, when damping or sprinkling articles preparatory to the ironing thereof, sprinkle or damp the articles by discharging water from his mouth.

Reception room for all articles to be provided. 6.—(1.) Every proprietor shall provide a room for the reception of all articles brought to the premises for laundering, cleaning or dyeing.

(2.) A proprietor shall not permit such room to be used for the storage, either temporarily or otherwise, of any food, or use, or permit any person to use, for sleeping purposes any of the workrooms of the premises.

Provision of wooden gratings on floor. 7. Every proprietor shall provide, on the floor and for a width of three feet in front of any washing troughs or washing machines, a wooden grating of such height as will prevent the employees from standing upon the floor.

Approved ventilation to be provided. 8. Every proprietor shall install approved means of ventilation and shall maintain such means of ventilation in effective working condition to the satisfaction of the Director-General or of an authorized officer.

Disinfection of certain articles. 9. Every proprietor shall cause such articles to be disinfected as the Director-General or an authorized officer directs.

Penalties. 10. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of, or any direction or requirement under, these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds; and, where the offence is a continuing offence, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day during which the offence continues, but so that the total penalty shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
