REGULATIONS UNDER THE BUILDING AND SERVICES ORDINANCE 1924-1928.

P URSUANT to the powers conferred upon me by the Building and Services Ordinance 1924-1928, I, Arthur Blakeley, the Minister of State for Home Affairs, hereby make the following Regulation to come into operation forthwith.

Amendment of Canberra Electric Supply Regulations.

Regulation 6 of the Canberra Electric Supply Regulations is repealed and the following regulation inserted in its stead:-

hot-water system

(2.) The charges prescribed in the last preceding sub-regulation shall be deemed to apply in respect to

(a) premises used for residential purposes only;

(b) premises in which the power load consists of heating and

(b) premises in which the point cooking appliances only;
(c) premises in which the power load consists of motors, the total connected horse-power of which does not exceed two horse-power;

(d) premises in which the power load consists of heating appliances and motors where the total connected horse-

power of the motors does not exceed two horse-power. (3.) The charges for the supply of electricity for power for

For each unit up to 500 units consumed in any one month

For each unit over 500 units so con-

For each unit over 1,000 units so con-

(4.) For the purposes of the last proceding sub-regulation, "Industrial purposes" shall mean purposes other than those indicated in sub-regulation (2.) of this regulation.

(5.) The charges prescribed in this regulation shall apply as regards any particular person in respect of all electricity consumed by that person since the last reading made before the first day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, of the meter or meters installed for the registration of the amount of electricity consumed by what person.
