Regulations under the Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930.

AMENDMENTS OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH (DAIRY)
REGULATIONS.

Compensation
for animals
affected with
tuberculosis.

1. Regulation 14 of the Public Health (Dairy) Regulations is amended by omitting sub-regulation (5.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-regulation:—

“(5.) Where an authorized veterinary officer requires an animal to be destroyed, the Minister shall pay to the owner of the animal a sum equivalent to 50 per centum of the value of the animal as assessed in accordance with this regulation, and if the animal is sold for slaughter, or the animal is destroyed and the carcass sold, the proceeds of the sale shall be payable to, and shall be retained by, the Commonwealth.”

2. Regulation 18 of the Public Health (Dairy) Regulations is amended by omitting sub-regulation (2.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-regulation:—

“(2.) Where an authorized veterinary officer orders the destruction of a cow, the provisions of regulations 14 and 15 of these Regulations with respect to compensation shall apply in relation to the destruction of that cow.”
