

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY.

Regulations under the Industrial Board Ordinance 1936-1939.

AMENDMENTS OF THE INDUSTRIAL BOARD REGULATIONS.

1. Regulation 1A of the Industrial Board Regulations is amended **Parts.** by adding at the end thereof the words "Part IV.—Miscellaneous."
2. After regulation 15 of the Industrial Board Regulations, the following Part and regulation are inserted:—

"PART IV.—MISCELLANEOUS.

"16.—(1.) Whenever the office of the deputy of the member of the Board who is the representative of the Commonwealth becomes vacant, the person to be appointed to the vacant office shall be determined by nomination in writing by the Public Service Board. Determination of person to be appointed deputy of member.

(2.) Whenever the office of the deputy of the member of the Board who is the representative of private employers becomes vacant, the person to be appointed to the vacant office shall be determined by nomination in writing by the Canberra Chamber of Commerce.

(3.) Whenever the office of a deputy of a member of the Board who is the representative of Commonwealth employees or of private employees becomes vacant, the person to be appointed to the vacant office shall be determined by election in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Board Election Regulations."
