## Regulation under the Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930.

### AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH (SALE OF FOOD AND DRUGS) REGULATIONS.

After regulation 95 of the Public Health (Sale of Food and Drugs) Regulations the following regulation is inserted:—

“95A. The licensee of any premises licensed under the *Liquor Ordinance* 1929-1938 shall cause a fixed tray to be provided under the outlet of any ale or beer pump installed in the bar-room of the premises, for the purpose of receiving ale or beer which drips from the pump or is spilt or overflows, in the course of serving ale or beer to the public, such tray to be connected and kept connected, to the satisfaction of an inspector, with the sewerage system of those premises.”
