Regulations under the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance 1927-1938.*

AMENDMENTS OF THE MAINTENANCE ORDERS (FACILITIES FOR ENFORCEMENT) REGULATIONS.

1. Regulation 10 of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Regulations is amended by omitting the words "the Court shall orders to be made to clerk direct that all payments due thereunder shall be made to some member of the Court. of the Police Force, who shall be furnished with a copy of the order and inserting in their stead the words "all payments due under the order shall be made to the Clerk of the Court".

2. Regulation 11 of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforce-collection, &c., ment) Regulations is amended by omitting sub-regulation (1.) and of moneys due inserting in its stead the following sub-regulation:—

"(1.) The Clerk of the Court shall—

(a) collect the moneys due under any such order and for that purpose take all necessary proceedings for enforcing payment as provided in sub-section (2.) of section 8 of the Ordinance; and

(b) transmit the moneys so collected to the clerk of the court from which the order originally issued.".
