Regulations 1956. No. 15.

Regulations under the Public Baths and Public Bathing Ordinance 1956.*

I, ALLEN FAIRHALL, Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Baths and Public Bathing Ordinance 1956*, hereby make the following Regulations.

PUBLIC BATHS AND PUBLIC BATHING REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Baths and Public Bathing Regulations.

2. In these Regulations—

Definitions.

“monthly ticket”, in relation to any public baths, means a ticket entitling the person to whom the ticket is issued to admission to the baths at any time when the baths are open to members of the public during the period of one month commencing on the day on which the ticket is issued;

“season”, in relation to any public baths, means the period commencing on the day on which the baths are first open to members of the public after the first day of October in a year and ending on the day on which the baths are last open to members of the public before the thirtieth day of April in the following year;

“season ticket”, in relation to any public baths, means a ticket entitling the person to whom the ticket is issued to admission to the baths at any time when the baths are open to members of the public during the season in respect of which the ticket is issued;

“single admission ticket”, in relation to any public baths, means a ticket entitling the person to whom the ticket is issued to be admitted to the baths on one occasion on the day on which the ticket is issued.

3. The baths described hereunder are declared to be public baths:—
(a) The baths known as the Manuka Swimming Pool situated in the Division of Griffith, Canberra;

Declaration of public baths.

(2.) The baths known as the Olympic Pool situated in the Division of Parkes, Canberra.

Charges for admission tickets.

4.—(1.) Subject to the next succeeding sub-regulation, the charge to be made for a ticket entitling a person to admission to any public baths which are not leased public baths shall be in accordance with the following table:—

(2.) The charge to be made for a single admission ticket entitling a school child in charge of a teacher to admission to any public baths referred to in the last preceding sub-regulation is three pence.

Hire charges and deposits.

5.—(1.) The charge for a service provided by the Minister at a public baths and referred to in the following table shall be in accordance with that table:—
