AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH (SALE OF FOOD AND DRUGS) REGULATIONS†

After regulation 4 of the Public Health (Sale of Food and Drugs) Regulations the following regulation is inserted:—

“4A. Food consisting of fish, crustaceans, molluscs, fish products or canned fish, shall be deemed to be adulterated if it contains more than one-half of a part of mercury calculated as the metal of mercury per million parts of fish, crustaceans or molluscs, as the case may be.”
