## About this republication

### The republished law

This is a republication of the *Magistrates Court (Security Industry Infringement Notices) Regulations 2003*, made under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes). It also includes any commencement, amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law up to 3 September 2003.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

### Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at [www.legislation.act.gov.au](http://www.legislation.act.gov.au)):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

### Editorial amendments

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication does not include amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

### Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol **U** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

### Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

### Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date is—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

**1 Name of regulations**

These regulations are the *Magistrates Court (Security Industry Infringement Notices) Regulations 2003*.

**3 Purpose of regulations**

The purpose of these regulations is to create a system of infringement notices under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, part 8, for certain offences against the Security Act.

*Note* The *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, pt 8 provides a system of infringement notices for offences against various Acts. The infringement notice system is intended to provide an alternative to prosecution.

**4 Notes**

A note included in these regulations is explanatory and is not part of these regulations.

*Note* See Legislation Act, s 127 (1), (4) and (5) for the legal status of notes.

**5 Meaning of Security Act**

In these regulations:

*Security Act* means the *Security Industry Act 2003*.

**6 Administering authority**

The administering authority for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act is the commissioner for fair trading.

**7 Infringement notice offences**

The *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, part 8 applies to an offence against a provision of the Security Act mentioned in schedule 1, column 2.

---

**8 Infringement notice penalties**

- (1) The penalty payable by an individual for an offence against the Security Act, under an infringement notice for the offence, is the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the offence.
- (2) The penalty payable by a corporation for an offence against the Security Act, under an infringement notice for the offence, is 5 times the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the offence.
- (3) The cost of serving a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act is \$34.

**9 Contents of infringement notices—other information**

- (1) An infringement notice served on a company by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act must include the company's ACN.

*Note* The requirement under this regulation is additional to the requirement under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, s 121 (1) (c).

- (2) In this regulation:

*company* means a company registered under the Corporations Act.

**10 Contents of infringement notices—identifying authorised person**

An infringement notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act must identify the authorised person by—

- (a) the authorised person's full name, or surname and initials; and
- (b) the date of issue of the authorised person's identity card; and

- (c) the date of expiry of the authorised person's identity card.

**11 Contents of reminder notices—identifying authorised person**

A reminder notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act must identify the authorised person by—

- (a) the authorised person's full name, or surname and initials; and
- (b) the date of issue of the authorised person's identity card; and
- (c) the date of expiry of the authorised person's identity card.

**12 Authorised people for infringement notice offences**

A person authorised by the commissioner for fair trading under the *Fair Trading (Consumer Affairs) Act 1973*, section 9 may serve—

- (a) an infringement notice for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act; and
- (b) a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act.

### 1 About the endnotes

Not all editorial amendments made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 are annotated in the amendment history. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.

Uncommenced amending laws and expiries are listed in the legislation history and the amendment history. These details are underlined. Uncommenced provisions and amendments are not included in the republished law but are set out in the last endnote.

If all the provisions of the law have been renumbered, a table of renumbered provisions gives details of previous and current numbering.

The endnotes also include a table of earlier republications.

If the republished law includes penalties, current information about penalty unit values appears on the republication inside front cover.
