**1 Name of regulation**

This regulation is the *Drugs of Dependence Regulation 2005*.

**2 Commencement**

This regulation commences on the commencement of the *Criminal Code (Serious Drug Offences) Amendment Act 2004*.

*Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

**3 Notes**

A note included in this regulation is explanatory and is not part of this regulation.

*Note* See the Legislation Act, s 127 (1), (4) and (5) for the legal status of notes.

**4 Drugs of dependence—Act, s 3 (1), def *drug of dependence***

Each of the following substances is a *drug of dependence* for the Act (other than part 2):

- (a) a substance mentioned in the *Criminal Code Regulation 2005*, schedule 1 (Controlled drugs), part 1.1 (Drugs of dependence);
- (b) an associated drug (within the meaning of that regulation, section 5 (2)) of a substance mentioned in that part;
- (c) a related drug (within the meaning of that regulation, section 5 (3)) of a substance mentioned in that part.

**5 Prohibited substances—Act, s 3 (1), def *prohibited substance***

Each of the following substances is a *prohibited substance*:

- (a) a substance mentioned in the *Criminal Code Regulation 2005*, schedule 1 (Controlled drugs), part 1.2 (Prohibited substances);
- (b) an associated drug (within the meaning of that regulation, section 5 (2)) of a substance mentioned in that part;
- (c) a related drug (within the meaning of that regulation, section 5 (3)) of a substance mentioned in that part.

**6 Drugs of dependence—Act, s 4, def *drug of dependence***

A substance mentioned in schedule 1 is a *drug of dependence* for the Act, part 2 (Manufacture).

**7 Repeal of Drugs of Dependence Regulation 1993**

The *Drugs of Dependence Regulation 1993* SL1993-14 is repealed.
