1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Magistrates Court (Litter Infringement Notices) Amendment Regulation 2005 (No 1)*.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on the day after its notification day.

Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

3 Legislation amended

This regulation amends the *Magistrates Court (Litter Infringement Notices) Regulation 2004*.

10 Contents of infringement notices—identifying person serving notice

An infringement notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act must identify the authorised person by—

- (a) for an authorised person who is a police officer—the police officer’s service number; or
- (b) for an authorised person under the Litter Act, section 14 (Appointment of authorised people)—
 - (i) the authorised person’s full name, or surname and initials; or
 - (ii) any unique number given, for this regulation, to the authorised person by the administering authority.

11 Contents of reminder notices—identifying person serving notice

A reminder notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act must identify the authorised person by—

- (a) for an authorised person who is a police officer—the police officer’s service number; or
- (b) for an authorised person under the Litter Act, section 14 (Appointment of authorised people)—
 - (i) the authorised person’s full name, or surname and initials; or

- (ii) any unique number given, for this regulation, to the authorised person by the administering authority.

12 Service of notices by authorised people

A police officer or an authorised person under the Litter Act, section 14 (Appointment of authorised people) may serve—

- (a) an infringement notice for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act; and
- (b) a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act.
