1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Occupational Health and Safety (General)* Amendment Regulation 2008 (No 1).

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on the day after its notification day.

Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

3 Legislation amended

This regulation amends the *Occupational Health and Safety* (General) Regulation 2007.

Note

This regulation also amends the *Magistrates Court (Occupational Health and Safety Infringement Notices) Regulation 2004* (see s 10 and s 11).

85 Employer to protect site of dangerous occurrence

9 Section 85 (1)

substitute

- (1) This section applies if an employer is required to give the chief executive notice of a dangerous occurrence under the Act, section 204 (1) (d).
- (1A) The employer must ensure that the site where the dangerous occurrence happened is not entered or otherwise disturbed—
 - (a) for 72 hours; or
 - (b) until an inspector directs otherwise.

Maximum penalty: 10 penalty units.
