**1 Name of regulation**

This regulation is the *Territory Records Regulation 2009*.

**2 Commencement**

This regulation commences on the day after its notification day.

*Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

**3 Dictionary**

The dictionary at the end of this regulation is part of this regulation.

*Note 1* The dictionary at the end of this regulation defines certain terms used in this regulation.

*Note 2* A definition in the dictionary applies to the entire regulation unless the definition, or another provision of the regulation, provides otherwise or the contrary intention otherwise appears (see Legislation Act, s 155 and s 156 (1)).

**4 Notes**

A note included in this regulation is explanatory and is not part of this regulation.

*Note* See the Legislation Act, s 127 (1), (4) and (5) for the legal status of notes.

**5 Meaning of *principal officer*—Act, s 8 (i)**

The person mentioned in an item in schedule 1, column 3, is declared to be the principal officer for the entity mentioned in the item, column 2.

***Victims of Crime Coordinator*** means the Victims of Crime Coordinator under the *Victims of Crime Act 1994*, section 14.
